(Charges apply during the summer months)	Huge sandy beach, a sea to paddle in and sand dunes to run around in. Dogs allowed all year, at certain times of the year some areas at Ynyslas may be cordoned off to protect plant habitats or nesting birds.
BORTH	Borth SY24 5HZ ///pans.incursion.foods SN 60834 89865 Borth village and beaches - Discover Ceredigion	Golden Sand & shingle *RNLI Lifeguard service in season*	Free parking is allowed along the sea wall with no time restrictions, just after you enter Borth from Ynyslas.	Dogs permitted all year round north of the Youth Hostel. Both the Ceredigion and the Wales coastal paths pass close to the beach and the area offers visitors several good walks. The beach is built up against a high sea wall which links a series of groynes for about two miles northwards towards the dunes and the wide estuary of the Dyfi at Ynyslas. At high tide only the pebble and shingle beach are visible, a storm beach built up against the protective sea wall, but at low tide the beach is transformed as the shallow gradient creates a vast expanse of clean, safe, golden sand. *Dogs are restricted from the beach north of the RNLI station to the Youth Hostel on the High Street between 1 May and 30 September inclusive BUT dogs are restricted from the area south of the RNLI station towards the cliffs beneath Cliff Road ALL YEAR ROUND due to a Public Spaces Protection Order*

Dogs can access the beach and water north of the bridge throughout the year. The northern end of the beach, which is the section furthest away from Aberystwyth, is a mix of sand and shingle, flanked by tall cliffs, and there are sea caves, rockpools and even fossils to be found along this stretch of the coast. *Dogs are restricted from the beach to the south of the river 1 May and 30 September inclusive*

The beach fronts the town of Aberystwyth, and you will find a promenade here that stretches for over a mile, skirting close to the sand. *Dogs are restricted between the north side of the Landing Stage, also known as the jetty, and the northern end of the beach at Craig Glais, more commonly known as Constitution Hill

Aberystwyth South Beach is known for being quieter than the North Beach lying between the main harbour and Aberystwyth castle. The southern end of the beach is a popular spot for those who like surfing and body boarding as the waves here tend to be slightly larger. *Dogs are restricted between the Castle Headland (northern limit) and the first groyne at the end of South Marine Terrace (southern limit) 1st May and 30th September inclusive*
TANYBWLCH (Also known as Penparcau)	Tanybwllch Nr Aberystwyth SY23 1BU ///blotches.limp.aspect SN579803 Llanrhystud to Aberystwyth - Discover Ceredigion	Sand & Shingle	Follow the signs to Aberystwyth marina parking at pay & display and take the road South of the harbour left at the fire station to access the beach.	Dogs allowed all year; beach is made up largely of coarse sand and shingle. Located just to the south of the wider Aberystwyth Harbour, Tanybwllch lies across the Afon Ystwyth. Tanybwllch Beach lies just outside the town of Aberystwyth and sits in the shadow of the towering Pen Dinas which is the site of a Celtic hill fort that dates from the Iron Age. Pen Dinas is home to a memorial in the form of an upturned cannon which marks the victory of Wellington in the Battle of Waterloo from 1815. The area which includes Pen Dinas and Tanybwllch were designated as a nature reserve in 1999. It is well worth the climb to the summit of the fort to get an aerial view of the beach as well as vistas that stretch out over the sea.

Accessible from a little road heading towards coast, just south of the village of Llanrhystud	Dogs allowed all year, the almost mile long beach has a wide expanse of sand at low tide, backed by a pebble and shingle bank. Beach consists of a long bank of pebbles with sand at low tide. There are two beaches in Llanrhystud, the south beach located on the southern side of the Afon Wyre river. To the north the coastline is much rockier.

Dogs have access all year to the this predominantly shingle and pebble beach, backed by low mud and clay cliffs, lies on the Ceredigion coast, about 5 miles northeast of Aberaeron.
LLANON Traeth Morfa Beach	Llanon SY23 5LX ///hoot.roadblock.symphony SN506667 Llanrhystud, Llanon, Aberarth and Aberaeron shoreline - Discover Ceredigion	Soft pebbles & shingle	Morfa Beach is located 1km south of Llanon, look for signpost to caravan park, small car park right on the beach.	Dogs have access throughout the year to the beach, it is made up of soft pebbles that lead to larger rocks at the rear. When the tide is low, you can expect to find a wide expanse of sand. Encircled by towering clay sea cliffs. Llanon Beach takes its name from Saint Non who was the mother of the patron saint of Wales, Saint David. This region is steeped in Welsh history as both Saint Non and Saint David would have lived in the Llanon Beach area around 500 AD. One of the signature features in the area are the fish traps which are dotted along the shore. These would have been placed here by Cistercian monks during the medieval period. They are made up of deep pools that were formed using large stones to trap the fish. The beach backs on to a lush rural landscape which was used in days of old as a place to grow barley, which in turn was used for brewing illicit alcohol in the 1800s.

Dogs have access throughout the year to this shingle & pebble beach. The shingle and pebble beach are interspersed with groynes and backed by grasslands. Parts of the beach feature low-rise clay cliffs. At low tide, some areas of coarse sand are exposed.

Dogs allowed all year on the stretch of rocky beach, backed by a coastal path lies about half a mile north of Aberaeron harbour. This stretch of rocky beach, backed by a coastal path lies about half a mile north of Aberaeron harbour. The beach is used by walkers, sailing enthusiasts and fishermen. It can also be a good place for birdwatching.

Dogs allowed to the south of the Groyne, towards the cliffs. A series of groynes run the length of the beach between which are pebbles. *Dogs are restricted between the Harbour Walls and the groyne to the south of Beach Parade between 1st May and 30th September inclusive*
GILFACH YR HALEN	Gilfach yr Halen Llwynceilyn SA46 OEU ///cashew.clapper.fund SN435613 New Quay to Aberaeron - Discover Ceredigion	Stones & shingle	No designated car park, care must be taken not to block the single-track road.	This small, secluded shingle and rock beach, backed by cliffs lies between New Quay and Aberaeron, The Ceredigion Coastal Path passes adjacent to the beach, The Afon Cwinten enters the sea here, and the cliffs are backed by rural land. There is a holiday village close to the beach.

Ample Parking at New Quay, pay & display, 20 mins walk along beach when tide is low or accessible by coastal path.	Can be accessed at low tide north of the Lifeboat station, or from Cei Bach all year round. Dogs have access throughout the year to Traeth Gwyn Cei Bach Beach, it is about a mile and a half to the west of New Quay, the beach is sheltered and generally quiet. The beach is close to a heritage coastal path, and you can walk all the way to Aberaeron. When the tide is low you can walk all the way to New Quay Harbour which takes around 20 minutes. Dogs are allowed on Harbour Beach ONLY between 1 October - 30 April. *Dogs are restricted from Harbour beach between the pier and Penpolin, the harbour wall next to the RNLI Lifeboat Station between 1 May and 30 September inclusive. * Harbour Beach is a designated Blue Flag beach, with clean, clear water, a designated safe swimming area and soft, fine sand. Harbour Beach is a relatively sheltered beach. Forming a broad sweep of golden sand, it is located immediately to the south of the harbour and pier. The bay is home to colonies of seals and bottlenose dolphins, and wildlife watching is an important part of the local economy.

Dogs are welcome on Dolau beach at any time of the year, it has pebbles, rocks, and coarse sand, and is close to all the amenities in New Quay.
Traeth COUBAL Beach	Nr New Quay SA45 9TU ///overture.basher.darts SN368590 Llangrannog to New Quay - Discover Ceredigion	Sand & Rock	Parking at New Quay pay & display	No restrictions on dogs on Traeth Coubal. It is a secluded sand and rock beach just to the west of New Quay. Only accessible from the Ceredigion Coast Path.
Traeth SODEN BACH (Cwm Silio)	Nr Cwmttydu SA44 6LH ///handbag.silver.eradicate SN362582 Llangrannog to New Quay - Discover Ceredigion	Sand & Shingle	Parking at Cwmttydu.	Dogs have access all year to the remote cove of Traeth Soden, it is set at the foot of a long-wooded valley through which the little Afon Soden river cascades. As this provides the only access from the road to the beach it is generally quiet, in fact Traeth Soden is known locally as “the secret beach”. The beach here is a mix of sand and shingle flanked by grassy headlands. The small stream cuts across the beach and sometimes forms a little lagoon above the high tide mark. As the tide goes out a rocky shoreline is revealed with a few rockpools

Dogs have access all year to the tiny cove at Traeth Gwrddon it is a real gem for explorers. Set at the foot of a steep, lush green valley this is a spot to get away from it all. The valley here was carved millenia ago by the water from melting glaciers. There is still a stream running down to the cove and there are a couple of little waterfalls on route. Once there were a handful of people living in the cove and making a livelihood fishing. The houses are gone but there are still steps cut into the rocks by the side of the stream. At low tide there is a good little patch of golden sand in the cove. However, as the tide comes in the beach all but disappears.
MWNT	Mwnt SA43 1QH ///grass.strumming.driver SN193518 Mwnt beach - Discover Ceredigion	Golden Sandy Beach	Mwnt Beach is owned by the National Trust. On arrival you'll find a large car park in a field. Parking at Mwnt is free for National Trust members or £4 a day for non-members . From here it is just a short walk to the beach or Foel y Mwnt.	The lovely little beach of Mwnt consists of a rectangle of sand backed by steep cliffs and overlooked by the dome-shaped headland of Foel y Mwnt. Owned by the National Trust. Much of Mwnt beach's attraction lies in its unspoilt natural beauty. With fine golden sand, turquoise sea and barely a sign of development this is a special place. One of the few buildings near the beach is the diminutive 14th century Church of the Holy Cross (Eglwys y Grog). This little whitewashed chapel was built for passing sailors and pilgrims who frequented the area in medieval times. Located within the Cardigan Bay Special Area of Conservation , the headland at Mwnt beach is a great spot for spotting dolphins, basking sharks and porpoises as well as a host of other wildlife. *Dogs are restricted from the entire beach between 1 May and 30 September *
PATCH	Gwbert on Sea SA43 3LN ///cashiers.coupler.roadways SN162485 Cardigan to Aberporth - Discover Ceredigion	Sandy Beach & stone	Limited parking on the side of the road, parking on the beach available ONLY when the tide is out.	Dogs have access throughout the year, the beach faces into the river rather than outwards towards the sea Patch is a sandy beach. It sits in an estuary behind a bank of sand dunes The beach faces the south-west into the river Teifi and due to winds and strong tides it is not recommended as a place for swimming. Instead, it is more commonly known for its fishing, water sports and in particular sailing

Bylaws on Ceredigion's beaches



The following beaches restrict dogs between the 1 May and 30 September inclusive in any year:

- **Aberaeron (South beach):** Dogs are restricted between the Harbour Walls and the groyne to the south of Beach Parade.
- **Aberystwyth (South Beach):** Dogs are restricted between the Castle Headland (northern limit) and the first groyne at the end of South Marine Terrace (southern limit).
- **Aberystwyth (North Beach):** Dogs are restricted between the north side of the Landing Stage, also known as the jetty, and the northern end of the beach at Craig Glais, more commonly known as Constitution Hill.
- **Aberporth:** Dogs are restricted from Dolwen Beach.
- **Borth:** Dogs are restricted from the beach north of the RNLI station to the Youth Hostel on the High Street from 1 May to 30th September. This section is covered by a local bylaw. **PLEASE NOTE** Dogs are restricted from the area south of the RNLI station towards the cliffs beneath Cliff Road between 1 May and 30 September. This section is covered by a **Public Spaces Protection Order**.
- **Clarach:** Dogs are restricted from the beach to the south of the river.
- **Llangrannog:** Dogs are restricted from the beach between Nant Hawen and Pen Rhip cliff to the left.
- **Mwnt:** Dogs are restricted from the entire beach.
- **New Quay:** Dogs are restricted from Harbour beach between the pier and Penpolion, the old harbour wall next to the RNLI Lifeboat Station.
- **Penbryn:** Dogs are restricted from the beach area to the south of Nant Hoffnant.
- **Tresaith:** Dogs are restricted from the southern part of the beach between the access steps and Carreg-y-Ddafad cliff.
